

Condemnation does little for public good

During town council meeting June 3, Mayor Weatherly indicated his trust for staff recommendations and his actions in the public good. His condemnation, however, proceeds now to threaten damages to trees at over \$70K, and a power line that zigzags over old US 1 and traverses developed property when undeveloped property is a more direct route.
