Dear Mr. Wicker,

I am writing in reference to the Western Wake Regional Waste Water Treatment Facility. The plans to locate this facility near the center of the unincorporated town of New Hill concerns me because: Section 4, Environmental Consequences, Lines 253 - 255 states:

*"In FY2006, the Town of Cary reported 2,169,067 total gallons spilled which is a higher volume than any of the utilities listed in Table 4-2 for FY2007. However, 2 million gallons of this was from one widely publicized construction accident."*

Articles in The News & Observer reflect the number of spilled gallons at 7,900,000, not 2,169,067. These articles may be read here: <http://newhillca.org/wdocs/Cary%20spill%20totals.pdf>

Why is USACE and their consultants covering up the number of gallons of raw sewage spilled during this environmental disaster?
