Dear Mr. Wicker,

I am writing in reference to the Western Wake Regional Waste Water Treatment Facility. The Final EIS is incomplete and inaccurate. For example:

Section 4, Environmental Consequences, Lines 89 - 91 state:

"It should be noted that these pipelines are in various stages of design. Because the designs have not been finalized, the easements are approximate and may be revised in some areas during final design to accommodate depths of excavations or other constraints."

It is my understanding that the purpose of the Final EIS is to give the public a chance to comment on the final plans. The WWP and their consultants have been targeting the site in New Hill since the early 2000s, and have had ample time to design the pipelines.

This is an example of poor workmanship with the FEIS by USACE, their consultants, and the WWP town staffs, and is yet another reason the Final EIS should be scrapped.
